United Launches Nonstop Service Between Melbourne, Australia and LAX
United now offers nonstop flights between Melbourne, Australia and LAX with the launch of Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner. United becomes the first North American airline to deploy the aircraft, the longest of any carrier. Currently running three times weekly, the flight will operate six times a week starting November 16.
